#### Conditions of success



- Competitive and creative companies
- Highly skilled workforce with right skills mix
- Education and training institutions
  - responsive to labour market needs
  - accessible to all
- Updated picture of future skills and jobs needed



#### Actions needed



- Up-skill workers → raise employability
- Invest in adequate skills policies
- Reduce skills mismatch → bring closer E&T and labour
- Develop partnerships



## Action at European level



- Develop increased knowledge of today and tomorrow's skills needs.
- Develop information at sectoral level on:
  - Quantitative trend of sector
  - Qualitative trend in terms of employment and skills
  - Tools and instruments to anticipate skills



#### How to develop this knowledge?



- Use existing national information in an EU perspective:
- National observatories on skills and jobs
- Facilitate exchange and cooperation at EU level



→ Create networks of national observatories on skills and jobs at sectoral level

#### Feasibility study - Results



- Involve social partners, national sector councils, education and training providers
- Focus first on information exchange and synthesis (output) only
- Joint policy development other option
- Include IVET and CVT
- Clearly defined targets
- Compulsory monitoring
- Evaluation needed (value-added for stakeholders)
- Financial and technical support needed from EU



#### Tasks and remits



- 1. Exchange of information and good practices:
  - quantitative trends
  - qualitative developments
  - Tools, processes, strategies
  - Analysis of information collected
  - Discussion and validation
  - Dissemination of results

#### 2. Joint policy initiatives

- Optional
- Conditional on success of option 1

#### Examples of potential types of actions:

- Proposals for sector qualification and competence standards at EU level
- Develop strategies in education and training
- Foster mobility of students
- Promote image of sector



#### Composition of EU sector council



#### For each sector:

- "Secretariat" of EU sector council (1 expert + 1 assistant)
- European sector-level representatives (social partners where exist)
- Representatives of national observatories (1/MS)
- Representatives from education and training providers at EU level
- European Commission (observer)



#### Meetings and possible outputs



#### Meetings:


- 2 per year with EU social partners and national observatories
- 1 conference/year with all stakeholders

(dissemination + evaluation)



#### Reports:

- Quantitative trends
- Qualitative trends
- Tools and instruments
- Recommendations





#### Governance





- To be created at request from stakeholders
- Steering of councils left to sector representatives
- Active role for EU social partners where they exist

- Added-value for stakeholders
- Temporary initiative
- Evaluation of output
- Financial support from Commission conditional





## Implementation: phases 0 and 1



#### Phase 0:

- Key actors: EU sectoral social partners
- Action: agree to create sector council





#### Phase 1: Identification of observatories

- Take part in EU network
  - Composition of EU network
  - Information to be exchanged
  - Prepare demand to setup EU Council

Duration of phase 1:4 to 6 months





## Implementation: phase 2



- Phase 2: Launch of Sector council
  - 2 meetings
  - 1 dissemination conference
  - Production of first reports



Evaluation

Define criteria and targets with participants related to:

Output

Commitment

Satisfaction

Added-value

EU support should be conditional





#### Transversal council



- Analysis of horizontal issues (transferable competences, green economy, mobility...)
- Discuss strategy, long-term vision
- Create bridges between sectors
- Composition:
  - 1 representative per EU sector council
  - representatives from national transversal councils
  - European Commission
