Physical energy flow accounts (PEFA): data production and dissemination

1 Introduction

Physical energy flow accounts (PEFA) are one of six modules in <u>Regulation 691/2011</u> and reporting will become mandatory in 2017.

In the years 2010 to 2014 a task force developed the PEFA questionnaire. The main concepts and principles of PEFA are documented in a draft <u>PEFA manual (version 2014)</u> and are widely based on the <u>system of environmental-economic accounting 2012 – central framework (SEEA-CF)</u> which matured/was developed around the same time as PEFA.

The <u>delegated act on energy products</u> was published on 10 February 2016 specifying the products for PEFA.

Voluntary data collections took place in 2014 and 2015 and another one is planned for 2016.

This document presents highlights from the 2015 data collection and presents the work planned for 2016.

2 Pilot data collection 2015 - overview

Launch and response rate

The voluntary pilot data collection was launched on 17 July 2015. Deadline for reporting the PEFA-questionnaire was 15 November 2015 which was met by 6 countries. In total 10 countries reported some of which in the context of a pilot project (grant agreement). See Table 1 for more detail.

Checking/validation procedures and 'Ping-Pong' with countries

Eurostat and its contractors developed a checking and validation procedure similar to those established for economy-wide material flow accounts (EW-MFA) and air emissions accounts

(AEA). The procedure is widely automated as EXCEL macros and includes the following checks:

- format of questionnaire;
- illegal symbols and footnotes;
- plausibility: comparisons with other questionnaires (e.g. of previous period);
- consistency: checking sub-totals and totals, supply = use (row-wise); input = output (column-wise).

Data validation and 'Ping-Pong' with countries started mid December 2015.

Eurostat did not undertake any gap-filling. The reported PEFA questionnaires seemed complete.

Data dissemination (data structure in EuroBase¹)

Publication of PEFA data on EuroBase is planned for April 2016. This will be the first time Eurostat publishes PEFA data as the results of the 2014 data collection were not published. The data structure employed in EuroBase is rather simple and reflects the five tables of the PEFA questionnaire.

3 Work planned for 2016

The 2016 version of the PEFA questionnaire will be worked out in the second quarter of 2016. Depending on the outcome of the working group discussions (see agenda item 1.3 for 14 April) the PEFA questionnaire might undergo some revisions (multi-annual layout, adding sub-tables B.1 and B.2).

The launch of the 2016 data collection is planned for June 2016. Deadline will be 15 October 2016.

The PEFA-builder (IT-tool) will be further refined, in particular the user-friendliness will be improved. Algorithms to populate PEFA Table C will be added. Depending on the outcome of the working group discussions (see agenda item 1.3) the PEFA-builder will be extended to accommodate and populate sub-tables B.1 and B.2. The video tutorial needs to be up-dated.

Revision work on the PEFA manual will start by the end of the year. Eurostat intends to publish a revised version in 2017 clarifying and refining methodological as well as compilation issues.

Calculating PEFA for the aggregated EU-28 is most likely not feasible for the coming data collection cycles due to the expected incompleteness (some countries have derogations).
