WHY DO WE NEED A EUROPEAN LABOUR AUTHORITY?

- *The free movement of workers and the freedom to provide services depend on well-functioning cross-border mobility.*
- *Member States are responsible for enforcement of EU legislation in fields of cross-border employment and social security coordination*
- ***There is a need for a Authority to support cooperation and ensure the fair and effective enforcement of EU rules***

Tasks

1) Services for individuals and businesses

- Enhancement of EURES

2) Cooperation between Member States

- Speed up exchanges

3) Risk assessment

- Analyses, peer reviews and follow up

Tasks

4) Support to joint inspections

- Logistical support and coordination

5) Mediation between national authorities

- All mobility areas, recommendations

6) Capacity Building

- Mutual-learning and assistance

Timeline

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- Legislative Proposal foreseen 13 March 2018
- Presentation at EPSCO 15 March
- Adoption by co-legislators by end 2018
- Up and running in 2019
- Fully in place and operational by 2023
