The brochure will be translated in several new languages and several oneday seminars will be organised in different countries.

Mr Lopes (DG EMPL) informed the participants on the 2012 deadlines.

6. NEW OSHA CAMPAIGN ON RISK PREVENTION

Mr Gehring informed the participants that yesterday OSHA organised a partnership conference in Brussels to present the new campaign "Working together for risk prevention". The prevention culture was underlined.

OSHA does not finance activities, but support stakeholders activities.
