Responsible Care Definition & Principles



Responsible Care is the global chemical industry's unique initiative to continuously improve performance and its main contribution to Sustainable Development.

Responsible Care Core **Principles**:

- Improve the safety health and environmental performance of its own activities.
- Use resources efficiently and minimise waste
- Report openly on their achievements and difficulties and
- Engage in dialogue with stakeholders, in particular the local communities who live and work around our sites
- Cooperate with regulators, set standards that go beyond regulation
- Provide help and advice to foster the responsible management of chemicals throughout the value chain.

- Initiate a Responsible Care networking programme dedicated to capacity building in small and medium sized companies
- Introduce and strengthen Responsible Care in business relations
- Pilot in selected countries involving a solid foundation of relevant stakeholders
- Outreach towards management and employees ("Top down"
 & "Bottom Up")
- Focus on key elements (SME needs): Health, Safety, Product Stewardship
- Involving performance leaders to serve as mentors to smaller business partners

Project Objectives



- Approach to access SMEs (management & employees)
 - Through business relations between companies
 - Via regional clusters of associations
- Approach of how to involve larger companies (performance leaders)
- Tool box SME involvement
 - Self evaluation tool for companies
 - SME workshop and training designs for key Responsible Care elements
 - Profile for kick-off workshops aimed at these key elements
- Training for national partners and mentor companies
- Profile for an online platform with a SME portal and blog
- Internal evaluation scheme & criteria for measuring success



National Pilots



- Testing and evaluating the project outline
- Conducting the first (3-4) workshops for representatives of SME in selected countries
- Organized by national federations, trade unions & mentor companies
- Start of online platform for all involved in the project to exchange views and experiences
- Reflection of pilots at one-day workshop
- Preparation for the roll out phase: contact partners in other countries for possible participation.

Project Justification



- Most of the companies visibly participating in Responsible Care are large companies often with established environmental, health and safety management systems.
- Better involvement of broad chemical sector (90% of an estimated 27,000 European chemical companies are classified as SME)
- SME engagement in performance improvement difficult to assess.
- SME lack time and resources to actively participate at association level.
- SME lack specialized environmental, health and safety experts to work in the Responsible Care networks of the associations.
- To invest into this work SME need to be convinced of the added business value to get engaged in Responsible Care.
