




Background

- Task Force makes recommendations to NADEG based on a scientific input
- Work done: method for (un)sustainable hunting, review of the bird's classification
- Ongoing work: Support action for the Turtle Dove, approach to allocate hunting quotas, assessment of hunting sustainability for a first batch of 15 species, identification of key actions non-hunting related, overview of actions on resident species
- Future work: Adaptive Harvest Management for 3 species
- 5 Meetings held: 18/03/2022, 07/11/2022, 21-22/03/2023, 01/12/2023, 19/04/2024 -Next meeting: 28 June
- Today: examine the recommendations of the Task Force and provide a NADEG recommendation on the T. Dove for each flyway for 2024 to Member States







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Western flyway of Turtle Dove

Conclusion of the task force for fulfilling the conditions for resuming hunting



Population increase of at least 2 years – *condition met*



Increase in survival (growth rate reliably equal to or above 1) – on track, still unable to confirm survival increase leading to growth rate $(\lambda) \geq 1$)



Credible **regulatory** and **control/enforcement systems** – some progress, insufficient development (disparities in deployment of measures, uneven efforts, unable to assess validity of existing systems)

Western Flyway: Technical recommendation for 2024 hunting season

<u>HUNTING</u>: maintain temporary moratorium; review in 2025

MS wanting to reopen hunting in 2025 should submit document to TFRB by <u>Oct 2024</u> explaining regulatory system to be applied once a national quota is agreed, and details of mechanism (and resources available) to assess compliance.

MANAGEMENT PRIORITIES:

- Improve mechanisms for implementing and enforcing reduced harvests
- Implement habitat management measures specifically targeted to TD
- Improve/implement monitoring mechanisms

RESEARCH PRIORITIES:

- Improve collection of survival data
- Implementation of national censuses and full surveys of abundance



Central Eastern flyway of Turtle Dove

Conclusion of the task force for fulfilling the conditions for allowing Turtle Dove hunting



Population increase of at least 2 years – *deviating from target*



Assessment of survival (growth rate reliably equal to or above 1) - unable to estimate survival and unlikely



Credible **regulatory** and **control/enforcement systems** – insufficient to guarantee reduced harvest

Central eastern Flyway: Technical recommendation for 2024 hunting season

<u>HUNTING</u>: Maintain and fully implement a temporary hunting moratorium

Complete harvest data and assessment of % hunters using App

MANAGEMENT PRIORITIES:

- Implement measures that are specifically targeted to TD
- Implementation of **monitoring mechanisms** for the efficacy of measures

RESEARCH PRIORITIES:

- Increase efforts for developing flyway-specific population model (initiate CMR programs for survival data)
- Collection of data on productivity
- Implementation of national surveys/censuses
