1.1 Import Procedures under the Food Sanitation Act

1.2 Standards for Chemicals/Additives

- MHLW: <u>Draft Positive Lists</u> of the chemicals and additives which are to be allowed to be contained in cookware and packaging of food products sold in Japan (Japanese, partially English)

 Positive List. Within that file a link is provided to the draft positive lists in excel (available both in
 Japanese and English).
 - The notification which prescribes the positive lists is scheduled to be published in February 2020, and the positive lists will be implemented from June 1, 2020. The Committee on the Regulation of Food Utensils, Containers, and Packaging recommended that the MHLW take a sufficient transition period for about 5 years before requiring all the relevant stakeholders to comply with the positive lists.

1.3 Display of Information regarding Safety on the Surface of Products (i.e., Precautions regarding Use and Expected Life of the Product)

- This obligation is applicable only to the toys which are used by inserting a plug into the electric outlet.
- Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry (METI): Electrical Appliances and Materials Safety Act Statutory Operations Implementation Guide For Manufacturers/Importers (<u>Version 3 English</u>, <u>Version 4 Japanese</u>)
 - The latest edition is available only in Japanese.
 - Exporters of electrical appliances are not required to submit a notification of business or to ensure electrical appliances' conformity with the technical requirements contained in the Electrical Appliances and Materials Safety Act; instead, this responsibility falls to the domestic manufacturers and importers of such appliances.
- METI: Electrical Appliances and Materials Safety Act Statutory Operations Implementation Guide For Manufacturers/Importers (Version 3 English, Version 4 Japanese)
 - The latest edition, is available only in Japanese
 - Exporters of electrical appliances are not required to submit a notification of business or to ensure electrical appliances' conformity with the technical requirements contained in the Electrical Appliances and Materials Safety Act; instead, this responsibility falls to the domestic manufacturers and importers of such appliances.

 - This information does not have to be affixed to the products at the time of importation.
 However, displaying the required information is a necessary prerequisite for distribution of the products in Japan.

1.5 Environmental Regulations which apply to Imported Goods in General

1.5.1 Labelling Requirements Prescribed under the Act on the Promotion of Effective Utilization of Resources

- Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry (METI): <u>Description of the Act on the Promotion of</u> Effective Utilization of Resources (Japanese)
 - Description of the requirement to put an identification mark on paper and plastic containers/packages which indicates that those containers/packages are made of paper or plastics that is recyclable.

1.5.2 Requirement to Recycle Containers/Packages Made of Paper, Plastic, PET, or Glass

 - Description of the requirement to recycle paper, plastic, PET, or glass containers/packages imposed on enterprises (which meet the thresholds for turnover or number of employees, and which import these containers/packages or use these containers/packages when they sell their products). These entities can also fulfill their obligations by paying commissions to the Japan Containers and Packaging Recycling Association, which is a public interest incorporated foundation.
