Roam Like at Home

Ukrainian nationals travelling to/ in the EU will not have to pay additional charges when using their phones in the EU, and EU visitors will have the same treatment in Ukraine.

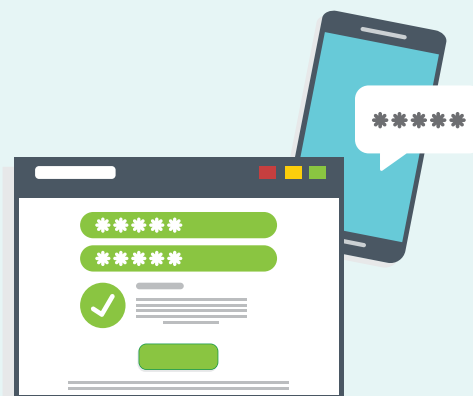
Free Circulation of Industrial Goods

Goods covered by the Agreement on Conformity Assessment and Acceptance (ACAA) will be able to circulate freely between the EU and Ukraine, increasing diversity, reducing costs for producers and lowering prices for consumers.



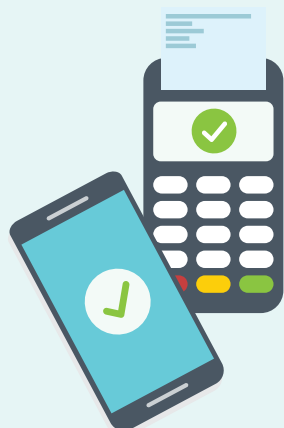
Smoother, More Secure Customs Clearance

A Mutual Recognition Agreement of Authorised Economic Operators between the EU and Ukraine will improve supply chain security and facilitate customs procedures, making trade easier.



Electronic Trust Services

Further cooperation on electronic trust services will allow EU and Ukrainian citizens to interact with public or private entities in the EU in a trustable way.



Ukrainian Access to the Single Euro Payments Area (SEPA)

Fast and safe cashless euro payments will be possible between Ukraine, the EU and a number of non-EU countries in SEPA.

*Drawn from the revised Priority Action Plan (PAP) for enhanced implementation of the EU-Ukraine Deep and Comprehensive Free Trade Agreement (DCFTA) in 2023-2024. The PAP lays down a set of 29 concrete actions to accelerate and monitor the full implementation of the DCFTA, providing Ukraine with further access to the EU Single Market.
