European Platform to enhance cooperation in the prevention and deterrence of undeclared work

Implications undeclared work

- Working conditions, health and safety
- Employment rights (annual leave, working time)
- Training, lifelong learning
- Employment security (redundancy payments, unemployment benefits)
- Pensions, healthcare,
- Unfair competition
- Reduction of tax revenues and social security contributions





Platform UdW – Consultations

- Consultations with the Member States (in particular, Directors General for Industrial Relations, SLIC, Administrative Commission for Social Security Coordination)
- 1st stage consultation with the social partners
- 2nd stage consultation with the social partners



Platform UdW - Scope

- Undeclared work Any paid activities that are lawful as regards their nature but not declared to public authorities, taking into account differences in the regulatory system of the Member States
- Bogus self-employment



Platform UdW - Main problem: governance

- Insufficient cooperation between MS
 - Lack of holistic approach; absence of common forum no pooling of experience
- Difficulties in tackling cross-border aspects
 - Traditional mechanisms were meant for domestic aspects of UDW; no knowledge about the counterparts in other MS; no data exchange



Platform UdW - Mission

- Exchange best practices and information
- Develop expertise and analysis
- Coordinate cross-border operational actions



Platform UdW - Composition

- Single Point of Contact per MS
 - 1 member + 1 alternate
 - Provide EC with the list of all enforcement authorities
 - Single Point of Contact will liaise with all enforcement authorities
- Representatives of the social partners
 - Max. 8 observers cross-industry level
 - Max. 10 observers from sectors with high incidence

Challenges

 Improving the implementation record of Member States, in particular by enhancing the capacity of micro and small enterprises to put in place effective and efficient risk prevention measures

Social Europe

- Improving the prevention of work-related diseases by tackling existing, new and emerging risks
- Tackling demographic change



7 key strategic objectives

- 1. Further consolidate national strategies
- Facilitate compliance with OSH legislation, particularly by micro and small enterprises
- 3. Better enforcement of OSH legislation by MS
- 4. Simplify existing legislation
- 5. Address the ageing of the workforce, emerging new risks, prevention of work-related and occupational diseases
- 6. Improving statistical data collection and develop the information base
- 7. Better coordinate EU and international efforts to address OSH and engage with international organisations



EU instruments

- 1. Legislation
- 2. EU funds
- 3. Social dialogue
- 4. Communication and information
- 5. Synergies with other policy areas

- Transmitted to EP, Council of Ministers, EESC, CoR

Outlook...

- Ex-post evaluation of EU OSH legislation, as provided for in Framework Directive 89/391/EEC and included in REFIT → end 2015
- Review of Framework in 2016 in light of this ex-post evaluation and progress on implementation of the Framework
