- Follow-up, evaluation and review (Clause 12) of the ETF/CER agreement on certain aspects of the working conditions of mobile workers engaged in interoperable cross border services: developing a joint project on the assessment of the implementation and application of the agreement (objective: submitting a project proposal 1st half of 2016)
- Health & safety at work: the drivers' cab
- Joint opinion on the future of rail freight transport in Europe

 OPE and TSI LOC&PAS)
- Monitoring of the implementation of the CER/ETF agreement on a European licence (now "complementary certificate")
